Why This Provincial Election Matters More Than Ever

As we approach the **upcoming provincial election**, I cannot stress enough how crucial this moment is for all of us as educators. The government we elect will shape the future of **our working conditions**, **our students' learning environments**, and the very foundation of public education in Ontario.

Under the current government, we've seen firsthand the impact of their decisions:

- Cuts to Education Funding Per-student funding has decreased, leading to larger class sizes, fewer resources, and job losses for educators, including occasional teachers.
- Unconstitutional Wage Restraints Bill 124 capped public sector wage increases at 1% per year, despite the rising cost of living. While the courts struck it down, this government has continued to fight against fair compensation.
- **Directed Hiring Practices** The province has interfered with hiring rules, limiting **fair and transparent staffing opportunities** for occasional teachers.
- Erosion of Public Education Their policies have weakened the system, placing greater strain on teachers and students alike.

The reality is simple: **who we elect determines our salaries, sick leave policies, benefits, and job security**. It also determines whether we work in well-funded, supportive schools or ones that continue to be under-resourced.

The current government is actively standing in the way of fair staffing, making it **harder for occasional teachers to secure stable employment**. Their approach prioritizes cost-cutting over student success, and we are already feeling the consequences.

This election is about **our future**, **our rights**, **and our profession**. We need to support candidates who believe in investing in education, respecting educators, and ensuring fair working conditions for all.

Mark your calendar: February 27 – Provincial Election Day. Make a plan to vote. Encourage your colleagues, friends, and family to do the same. Our collective voice has power—let's use it to protect public education.


